Project Description:

The Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) proposes to microsurface 2.55 miles of U.S. Route (USR) 62 from Straight Line Mile (SLM) 0.00 to SLM 2.55 in Liberty and Hubbard Townships, Trumbull County. Additional improvements proposed by this project include partial depth pavement repairs, the application of center/edge/stop lines and the installation of raised pavement markers.

During project construction, a minimum of one (1) 10-foot lane of traffic shall be maintained in each direction on the existing pavement and completed pavement. No substantial traffic disruptions are anticipated with the project.

Based on the project scope of work, its Path 1 Preliminary Development Process (PDP) Classification and the proposed maintenance of traffic measures, emergency/public services contact activities were not conducted for the project. Information about this project is posted to the Trumbull County listing on the Public Meetings/Public Involvement page of the ODOT District 4 website.

The project will be constructed within the existing roadway right-of-way.

Existing utilities within the project study area will not be impacted/relocated to construct the project.

Based on the proposed scope of work, the project has minimal potential to cause effects to historic properties under Appendix A. The project will not impact any environmentally sensitive resources within the project study area.

The environmental document and associated studies, as applicable, were approved using the preliminary scope of work for the project. When available, the project plans will be reviewed by ODOT District 4 Environmental Section personnel and uploaded to the Project File/General/Project Information subsection as Stage 3 Design.pdf.
