Project Description:

The Ohio Department of Transportation is proposing to reconstruct US Route 6 in Henry County from the Williams County line to State Route 34. All work is within the existing right of way and there will be no utility impacts. This project is not located within a flood hazard area and there will be no impacts to any waterways so no floodplain permits or waterway permits from the US Army Corps of Engineers are required. This project is not located near any historically significant resources so there is minimal potential to cause effects. There are also records of state threatened species in the area, however there is no suitable habitat within the project area so there will be no impacts to this species. Construction is expected to begin in the summer of 2021 and last approximately 60 days. During construction, all pedestrian and vehicular traffic will be maintained at all times.

This document was written and approved based on Stage 2 plans.

The contractor shall immediately remove through non-mechanical means any material that falls into the roadside ditches, streams, wetlands, or other waters. Under no circumstances shall the contractor work in or store equipment and/or materials in any wetlands, streams, or other waters. No work or staging is permitted below the top of bank of any stream and/or within a wetland.
