Project Description:

The Ohio Department of Transportation is proposing to perform maintenance on the State Route 65 bridge over the NSRR in Toledo OH. Work includes replacing the deck of the bridge, installing vandal fence, and approach pavement work. All work is within the existing right of way and utility relocations are possible. Since there is no work in any waterways, a permit from the USACE is not required. There will be no work in or above a floodplain so there is no FEMA coordination required. There will also be no impacts to suitable habitat for any state or federally listed species. It has been determined by the district that this project will not impact any property listed on or eligible for the National Register of Historic Places or other significant historical resources. Construction is expected to begin in the spring of 2020 and last approximately 90 days. During construction, both vehicular and pedestrian traffic will be maintained.

This document was written and approved based on Stage 2 plans.
