Project Description:

The Ohio Department of Transportation is proposing to resurface State Route 53 from the Senaca county line to US Route 6. All work is within the existing R/W and no utilities will be impacted. This project does pass through several floodplains, however there will be no impacts as determined by the district hydraulic engineer. There will be no impacts to any ecologically significant resources. Since there is no work outside of the right of way and there are no historic districts near this project, there is minimal potential to cause effects on historical resources. A plan note will be added to the plans to ensure that all public drinking water sources are protected during construction. Construction is expected to begin in spring 2020 and last approximately 60 days total. During construction, a minimum of 1 lane of traffic will be maintained at all times.

This document was written and approved based on Stage 2 plans.
