Project Description:

The Ohio Department of Transportation is proposing the deck sealing of various bridges in Lucas county along US-23, US-24 and I-475. All work is within the existing right of way and there will be no impacts to any utilities. There will be no impacts to any waters of the US and even though some bridges are located within a floodplain, there will be no impacts to the floodplain. This project has minimal potential to cause effects to any historical resources and there will be no impacts to any listed species or their habitats. The project will begin in the spring of 2021 and take approximately 120 days. During construction, a minimum of 1 lane of traffic will be maintained at all times.
