### Project Description:

The City of Toledo is proposing to resurface Holland-Sylvania Rd from Bancroft to Elmer in Lucas County. Additional work includes the installation of a new overhead lane use sign on the northwest corner of the Bancroft and Holland-Sylvania intersection. All work is within the existing right of way and there will be no utility impacts. There are no water resources or floodplain within the project limits to no permits are required. There will be no impact to any state or federally listed species or their habitats. This project has minimal potential to affect historic resources. Construction is expected to begin in the summer of 2021 and last approximately 60 days. During construction, a minimum of one lane will be maintained at all times.
