Project Description:

The Lucas County Engineers Office is proposing to resurface King Rd from Central Ave to Kings Pointe Road in Lucas County. Additional work includes minor drainage improvements and the addition of sidewalk. All work is within the existing right of way and there will be no utility impacts. There are no impacts to any water resources so no permits from the USACE are required. The project is not located within a floodplain so there will be no impacts. There will be no impact to any state or federally listed species or their habitats. This project has minimal potential to affect historic resources. Construction is expected to begin in the summer of 2021 and last approximately 60 days. During construction, a minimum of one lane will be maintained at all times.

This document was written and approved based on Stage 2 plans.

This project is not currently on the STIP, however, the next phase is non-federal 100% locally funded and is fiscally constrained
