Project Description:

The Ohio Department of Transportation is proposing a project to resurface State Route 100 from the Crawford County line to Riverside Drive and State Route 53 from the Tiffin Corporation Line to south of Cottage Avenue in Tiffin in Seneca County. No new right of way is needed for the project and there will be no impact to any utilities. This project is not located near any waters of the US or in any floodplains so no permits are required. There will be no impacts to any state or federally listed species or their habitat. It has been determined that no historic properties will be affected by this project. Construction is expected to begin in the summer of 2021 and last for approximately 150 days.

This document was written and approved based on Stage 2 plans.
