Project Description:	

The Cuyahoga County Department of Public Work's (CCDPW's) Ridge Road (C.R. 10) (PID 112546) rehabilitation and reconstruction project is located in the cities of Parma, Brooklyn, and Cleveland in Cuyahoga County, Ohio. A project location map is included in the project file (*see Project File<General<Project Information<County Map*).

The project will resurface approximately 0.4 miles of Ridge Road from north of Pearl Road to approximately 300 feet north of Brookpark Road, although no work will take place in the Ridge Road/Brookpark Road intersection. The project will completely remove and replace the pavement for approximately 0.3 miles of Ridge Road from 300 feet north of Brookpark Road to Flowerdale Avenue. The new pavement will match the existing pavement footprint and elevation. The project will also include pavement marking, spot sign improvements and upgrading all curb ramps to be compliant with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). The project will take place entirely within the existing transportation right-of-way. No pavement widening or property acquisition will be required. Utility impacts will be limited to adjusting castings on valve boxes and manholes to match the new roadway surface.

Two-way traffic and access to commercial properties along Ridge Road will be maintained at all times during construction. Pedestrian detours will be provided as needed. To accommodate the pavement replacement, the eastbound and westbound entrance ramps to I-480 will each be closed for 30 days or less, and detours will be provided. The public, local schools, police, fire and emergency services will be notified a minimum of 14 days prior to the start of construction and before any temporary alterations to traffic patterns are made.

Public involvement was completed during the project's development. A project fact sheet providing a project description, construction schedule, and contact information for questions and comments was posted to the CCDPW website (*see Project File<Public Involvement<Project Information<Stakeholder Notification-Website*). A press release offering the opportunity for public comment was issued by CCDPW (*see Project File<Public Involvement<Project Information<Press Release*). Stakeholder notification letters providing a project description, schedule, and map were also mailed to local schools, police, fire and emergency services (*see Project File<Public Involvement<Project Information<Stakeholder Notification-Letters*). Two comments were received during the comment period. A summary of the comments and responses is included in the project file (*see Project File<Public Involvement<Project*
