Project Description:

The Fulton County Commissioners are proposing a project to replace existing guardrail along various routes in Fulton County. There will be no impacts to any utilities and there all work is within the existing right of way. There will be no impacts to any jurisdictional waterways or floodplains so no permits are required. There will be no impacts to any streams/wetlands or any other habitats for state or federally listed species. There are no historic resources within the project limits so the project has minimal potential to cause effects. Construction is expected to begin in the summer of 2021 and will last approximately 45 days. During construction, lane closures are expected.
