- 1) Construction of this project will be conducted such that it does not interfere with waterway traffic between April 1 and November 30 of any calendar year for Section 9 Waterways (Maumee River mouth up to I-75, Lake Erie, West Harbor, Sandusky Bay, Toledo Harbor, Toussaint River, Port Clinton Harbor, and Put-In Bay). During this period the channel will be open to navigation per the schedule posted at the bridge. - 2) Pedestrian access shall be maintained through the construction zone at all times
- 3) Light pole replacement located in historic districts require in-kind replacements. Any diversion from the original design must be approved by the District Environmental Coordinator (DEC) prior to disposal of the existing
- 4) The contractor shall take all precautions to prevent any and all material from going off the edge of bridge deck(s) and edge of culvert(s) during all construction operations. The contractor shall immediately remove through non-mechanical means any material that falls into the roadside ditches, streams, wetlands, or other waters. Under no circumstances shall the contractor work in or store equipment and/or materials in any wetlands, streams, or other waters. No work or staging is permitted below the top of bank of any stream and/or within a wetland.
- 5) The contractor shall not remove any trees under this project. The project is located within the known habitat ranges of the federally listed and protected Indiana bat and northern long-eared bat. This requirement is necessary to avoid and minimize impacts to these species as required by the Endangered Species Act. For the purposes of this note, a tree is defined as a live, dying, or dead woody plant, with a trunk three inches or greater in diameter at a height of 4.5 feet above the ground surface, and with a minimum height of 13 feet. Should a tree be a safety hazard for the traveling public, the tree should be cut as soon as possible.
- 6) Access to all multi-use paths shall be maintained at all times during construction.
