Project Description:

The Ohio Department of Transportation is proposing to upgrade existing traffic signals at the intersection of State Route 795 and the I-75 ramp in Wood County and on US Route 20 near Solomon Lutheran School in Woodville, Sandusky County. Work includes replacing the side mounted signals, pull boxes, cabinets, and conduit at intersections. All work is within the existing right of way. Some utility relocations are expected. This project is not located within a special flood hazard area so there will be no impacts to the floodplain. There are no waterway impacts within the project area so no permits are required from the USACE. There is no suitable habitat for any state or federally listed species within the project area so there will be no impacts to any ecological resources. The work included in this project has minimal potential to cause effects to historical resources. Construction is expected to begin summer of 2023. During construction, there will be lane closures at all locations.
