### Project Description:

The Ohio Department of Transportation is proposing to resurface SR 18 from SR 109 to Marion; SR 109 from Hubbard to SR 18 and CR G to N of Deph St. in Henry County due to poor pavement conditions. All work is within the existing right of way and there will be no impacts to utilities. This project does not include impacts to any waterways or floodplains, therefore no US Army Corps of Engineers or floodplain permits are required. There will be no impacts to any ecological or historically significant resources. Construction is expected to begin in the fall of 2023 and last approximately 290 days. During construction, one lane of traffic will be maintained at all times.
