- 1) **Erosion Controls:** Sediment and erosion controls shall be properly installed and maintained throughout the duration of the project. Particular attention shall be given to any drainage ways, unprotected slopes, or ditches that could convey sediment laden water directly to streams or other surface waters. Ensure timely seeding and mulching once work has commenced.
- 2) **Storage of Fuels, Petrochemicals and Equipment:** Idle equipment, petrochemicals, or toxic/hazardous materials should not be stored in the floodplain or near any drainage ways, ditches, or streams. Petrochemicals or toxic/hazardous materials should not be used near or discharged into floodplains, drainage ways, ditches, streams, or other surface waters.
- 3) **Spill Prevention:** Any spills of toxic and/or hazardous materials shall be prevented to the maximum extent possible, however, if a spill occurs, it shall be immediately addressed by containment and cleanup. All spills must be reported to the Ohio Spill Line (1-800-282-9378) in accordance with OAC 3750.06.
- 4) **Material Disposal:** Any and all construction debris, earthen debris, excess asphalt or concrete, wood debris from clearing, excess fill material, material excavated, and trash shall be disposed of at an approved upland site or land fill above 100-year flood elevations.
