Project Description:

The City of Toledo is currently proposing to install a multi-use path on the Martin Luther King Memorial Bridge from Summit St to International Park due to poor pavement conditions. Additional work includes structural modifications to the bridge to accommodate the path. The project will connect paths on either side of the bridge. All work is within the existing right of way and there will be no impacts to utilities. This project is located within a special flood hazard area. All National Flood Insurance Program requirements will be met and coordination with local floodplain administrators is on-going. There will be no impacts to any ecological or historically significant resources. Construction is expected to begin in the fall of 2024 and last approximately 60 days. During construction, one lane of traffic will be maintained at all times.

This document was approved based on Stage 2 plans.
