Project Description:

The City of Rossford in coordination with the Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) is currently proposing to construct a modern single-lane roundabout at Glenwood Road/Bergin Street and SR-65 in Wood County for safety reasons. This project does not include regulated ecological impacts and an Ecologically Exempt Ecological Survey Report was submitted and approved by ODOT District 2 on June 10, 2024.

Coordination with the following Utility Owners is ongoing for this project; The City of Rossford, Columbia Gas of Ohio (Toledo), Toledo Edison, Buckeye Cable, AT&T, Northern Buckeye Education Council, Northwestern Water and Sewer District (NWWSD), and Advanced Communications and Data.

Partial permanent right-of-way takes from three properties are needed to facilitate the construction of this project and no structure takes are proposed. A detour during construction is proposed with this project.

A property owner letter was sent out on September 11, 2024, which included an invitation to the open house 9/11/2024. The invitation to the open house was also posted on the City of Rossford's website. The Open House held at the City of Rossford Recreation Center on September 27, 2024. A total of 13 comments were received from the open house and comments included concern for losing parking, increase in traffic, and general approval and disapproval of the project. Response letters were sent to ten people on December 10, 2024. Copies of the Public Involvement materials, comments, and responses can be found in the Project Folder/Public Involvement/Project Information.

A Detour Letter was sent to the City of Rossford on December 20, 2024, to send to local emergency agencies and schools to notify them of the detour that will be caused by this project. A copy of the letter with a schematic of the detour plan are included in the Project File/Public Involvement/Project Information/Detour Notification Letter.

The Environmental Document was prepared using Stage 2 plans which are available in the Project File/General.

Cultural Resources Remarks

A review of OSHPO data and online mapping concluded there are no inventoried buildings (OHI) and no known archaeological sites (OAI) in the immediate study area. No listed or eligible historic properties are found in the greater study area or in the project area/area of potential effects (APE). Aerial survey and the literature search documented the entire area has been previously disturbed by urban development including roadway construction, underground utilities, and general landscaping. As a result, impacts to cultural resources are unlikely. Improvements to divided highways and projects where the proposed right-of-way measuring less than a full travel lane are project types exempt from further cultural resource consideration by the 6/29/23 Cultural Resource PA (Agreement 38503), as long as the project is not within the boundaries of any historic property or N. R. district.

Tribal Consultation Summary/Remarks:

ODOT notified the Miami Tribe of Oklahoma on July 8, 2024. The tribe responded on August 28, 2024 and did not object to the project. A copy of the letter is included in the Project File/Cultural Resources/Coordination/Tribal Comments - Miami Tribe.pdf
