Project Description:

The City of Sylvania is proposing reconstruct Main Street in Sylvania in Lucas County. The existing roadway width will undergo a road diet reducing the traveled lanes in each direction from 16' to 12' with bike lanes added on each side, includes replacement of traffic signal due to poor pavement conditions and the need for improvement. All work is within the existing right of way and there will be no impacts to utilities. This project does not include impacts to any waterways or floodplains, therefore no US Army Corps of Engineers or floodplain permits are required. There will be no impacts to any ecological or historically significant resources. Construction is expected to begin in the fall of 2024 and last approximately 120 days. During construction, local traffic will be maintained at all times.
