Project Description:

The City of Toledo is currently proposing a project to perform major pavement reconstruction of Secor Road from Laskey Road to Alexis Road. Additional work includes replacement of curb and gutter, drive aprons, minor necessary drainage improvements, and replacement of ductile iron pipe that will be disturbed during construction. Permanent right of way will be required from 1 residential property and 11 commercial properties. Temporary right of way will be acquired from 6 residential properties and 15 commercial properties. This project is located within a special flood hazard area. All National Flood Insurance Program requirements will be met and coordination with local floodplain administrators is on-going. Construction is expected to begin in the spring of 2025 and last approximately 160 days. During construction, one lane of traffic will be maintained at all times.

This document was written and approved based on Stage 2 plans.
