Project Description:

The Ohio Department of Transportation is currently proposing to repair a landslide on US-6/20 at SLM 17.67 in Sandusky County, just East of the Sandusky River, due to poor slope conditions. All work is within the existing right of way and there will be no impacts to utilities. This project does not include any impacts to any waterways or floodplains, therefore no US Army Corps of Engineers or floodplain permits are required. There will be no impacts to any ecological or historically significant resources. Construction is expected to begin in the summer of 2025 and last approximately 90 days. During construction, one lane of traffic will be maintained at all times.

This document was approved based on Stage 2 Plans.
