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The CUY-US-006-25.95 project will involve the asphalt resurfacing of Chardon Road (US 20) from East 221st Street to the East Corporation Line in Euclid, Cuyahoga County, Ohio. Additionally, the project will include upgrades to ADA curb ramps, pavement repairs, partial curb replacement, pavement markings, and signage. Construction is currently scheduled to begin in the summer of 2025.

Mapping that depicts the project location and limits on United States Geological Survey 7.5-Minute Topographic Quadrangle is included in the Project File/General/Project Information subsection.

It is anticipated that the proposed work along Chardon Road will be performed as multi-phase part width construction, so as to not restrict access to adjacent businesses or residences. A one-way eastbound traffic lane will be established while performing repairs and improvements to Chardon Road. During this time westbound traffic will be detoured along Richmond Road and Euclid Avenue. A minimum of one lane of traffic in each direction will be maintained during the paving of Chardon Road. Substantial traffic disruptions are not expected during project construction.

The project will be constructed within the existing right-of-way, no permanent or temporary right-of-way acquisition are proposed for this project. The Stage 2 Design plan sheets are included in the Project File/General/Project Information subsection.

There is no anticipated relocation of existing utilities within the project study area. Coordination with the utility companies was conducted during the project's preliminary engineering phase and will continue during its detailed design phase.

On April 2, 2024 the Ohio Historic Preservation Office (OHPO) provided historical data for the proposed project area. Three (3) historical sites were identified within 500 feet of the proposed project and are listed in the Ohio Historical Inventory (OHI) database. The three (3) listed sites include the Mary R. Nevill House (CUY0164722), SP Mason House (CUY0164822), and the Shelton Residence (CUY0869222). Based on the project scope, the proposed resurfacing and upgrades to Chardon Road would unlikely impact the listed sites.

In accordance with Stipulation V(C)(1) and Appendix A of the Section 106 Programmatic Agreement executed on November 8, 2017 (Agreement N0. 19319), amended on July 11, 2019, ODOT-OES has determined that the proposed project is a type of undertaking that has 'minimal potential to cause effects' to historic properties and is not a part of a larger undertaking. See cultural resources documentation for the project in the Project File/Cultural Resources/Coordination subsection and the Cultural Resources Tab.

ODOT reviewed the RMR Screening and on April 25, 2024, a determination was made that no further RMR or special material management is warranted for the project. The RMR documentation for the project can be found in the Project File/ESA/Reports subsection.

Based on a consideration and ecological review, the project does not have the potential to impact ecological resources regulated under the Sections 404 or 401 of the Clean Water Act, Section 7 of the Endangered Species Act, or the Fish and Wildlife Coordination Act, and should not result in any activities that violate ORC Chapters 1518 and 1531, or Section 1533.324. This project is considered Ecologically Exempt under the Ecological MOA (Agreement 19394). See the Ecologically Review Form Ecological Exempt.pdf in Project File/Ecological/Reports subsection.

The project will not impact any other environmentally sensitive resources within the project study area.

Various public involvement activities were conducted for this project; including notification letters to property owners, stakeholders, and residents that could potentially be impacted by the project. In addition, a press release was posted on the City's website. Two (2) comments were received during the 30-day comment period. The comments were provided by owners concerned about access to their properties. A response was provided to the property owners informing them that they would not lose access. In conclusion the public involvement has been addressed and the city of Euclid has decided to proceed with the project. The environmental document and associated studies, as appropriate, are being approved using Stage 1 Design plan sheets. A copy of the plans is included in the Project File/General/Project Information/Stage 2 Design.pdf.
