Project Description:	



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The Stark County Engineer's Office (SCEO) proposes to apply pavement markings, as necessary, along various county routes throughout Stark County. Stage 2 plan information identifies pavement marking operations to be performed along approximately 49.245 miles of roadway in Bethlehem, Lexington, Lake, Marlboro, Nimishillen, Osnaburg, Paris, Pike, and Washington Townships. A copy of the Stage 2 Design plans for the project is included in the Project File/General/Project Information subsection as *Stage 2 Design.pdf*.

A minimum of one bidirectional lane of traffic will be maintained on the existing pavement during pavement marking operations. Road closures and detours are not proposed to construct the project. Construction and lane restriction/reduction information will be posted within the project construction limits prior to the start of project construction. Access shall be maintained to all adjacent properties, businesses and intersecting side streets for the duration of the project. Substantial traffic disruptions are not expected during project construction.

The project will be constructed within the existing roadway rights-of-way.

Existing utilities within the project areas will not be impacted/relocated to construct the project. Based on the project scope of work, its Path 1 Project Development Process (PDP) Classification and the proposed maintenance of traffic measures, emergency/public services contact activities were not conducted for the project. Construction activities will focus on the existing pavements. No buildings will be involved in construction and no relocations or additional right-of-way acquisition will be required by the project. A records check was conducted to determine if previously recorded cultural resources have been identified within the project areas. The records check included a review of electronic data from Ohio's State Historic Preservation Office (OSHP) GIS database to identify properties listed on or eligible for the National Register of Historic Places (NRHP). The database also includes records from the Ohio Historic Inventory (OHI), Ohio Archaeological Inventory (OAI), as well as properties that have previously received a Determination of Eligibility (DOE). The OSHP GIS database shows no historic districts present in the vicinity of the Area of Potential Effect (APE). In accordance with Appendix A of the Section 106 Programmatic Agreement, the proposed project is a type of undertaking that has 'minimal potential to cause effects' to historic properties and is not a part of a larger undertaking. No further coordination is required in accordance with the Section 106 Programmatic Agreement. Based on the information in the Regulated Materials Review (RMR) Form completed for the project, further RMR activities or special materials management are not warranted for the project. See the RMR documentation for the project in the Project File/ESA/Reports subsection.

Additionally, this project is considered ecologically exempt under the Ecological MOA (Agreement 19394). See the *Ecologically Exempt STA-Pavement Markings FY2025.pdf* for the project in the Project File/Ecological/Reports subsection.

The work proposed by the project is considered roadway maintenance that will not impact any base flood elevations and, therefore, is exempt from the normal permit process required for work encroaching on a special flood hazard area (SFHA). Floodplain coordination is not required for the project. See the floodplains documentation for the project in the Project File/Permits/Floodplains subsection.

The project will not impact any environmentally sensitive resources within the project study areas.

The environmental document and associated studies, as applicable, were approved using the Stage 2 Design plans for the project. A copy of the Stage 2 Design plans for the project is included in the Project File/General/Project Information subsection as *Stage 2 Design.pdf*.

The estimated total project cost specified in Ellis is equal to the total project cost specified in the ODOT State Fiscal Years 2024 - 2027 Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP). Fiscal constraint is at the Statewide Line Item (SLI) Group level. An individual project utilizing a SLI does not require a STIP/TIP amendment.
