Project Description:

This City of Toledo project will resurface Sylvania Ave between Douglas Rd and Upton Ave, including spot full-depth pavement repairs, sidewalk improvements, minor drainage improvements, and curb repairs as needed. Additionally, includes Safety funding to install high visibility crosswalk markings at that intersection of Bellevue Rd, and install a Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacon and refresh the high visibility crosswalk markings at the Chessie Circle Trail. Temporary right of way from 4 commercial parcels will be required to remove and replace the sidewalk. Since there is no work within any waters of the US and there are no floodplain impacts, no permits are required. There are some ecological species located within 1 mile of the project sites, but there will be no impacts to any state or federally listed species or their habitat. This project has a minimal potential to cause impacts to any historical resources. Construction is expected to begin in the summer of 2026 and last approximately 60 days. During construction, one lane of traffic will be maintained at all times.
