Project Description:

The Cuyahoga County Department of Public Works (CCDPW), in cooperation with the Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) proposes to improve West 140th Street in the City of Cleveland, Cuyahoga County. The CUY-West 140th Street Rehab (PID122961) project includes the resurfacing of approximately 2.14 miles of West 140th Street from Puritas Avenue to Lakewood Heights Boulevard. Proposed rehabilitation includes installation of new asphalt intermediate and surface courses; full and partial depth pavement repairs; curb, walk and drive apron repairs as needed for curb ramp and base repairs; and installation of ADA compliant curb ramps. All work will be within the existing road right-of-way. No temporary or permanent right-of-way and no utility relocations are anticipated as part of this project. No work in streams, wetlands, or pollinator initiative sites. No tree removal. A Cultural Resources Records Check was performed using the online OSHPO ArcMap Resource Map using the Ohio State Preservation Office GIS Data website. No Cultural Resources listed on or determined eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places were identified within the proposed project area. The undertaking is a type which has minimal potential to cause effects to historic properties in accordance with Minimal Potential to Cause Effect - Appendix A of the Section 106 Programmatic Agreement. No further coordination is required. The Records Check can be found in the Project File Under Cultural Resources/Project Information. District approval date 6/30/2025.

This project is not located in a floodplain. This C1-level rehab project has such a remote chance of affecting base flood elevation that it is excluded from analysis.

No tree clearing will occur on this project and all work will occur on the existing roadway, drives, and sidewalks. There are also no records of state or federally listed plants or animals within one mile of the specified project area. Therefore, no ecological impacts are anticipated.

Construction is expected to begin Spring of 2027 and last approximately 120-150 days. During construction, detours will be posted. One 11-foot lane will be maintained in the north-bound direction. Access to all properties will be maintained throughout construction. See the Maintenance of Traffic Plan can be found in the Stage 3 Plans for the project in the *Project File/General/Project Information subsection*.

Construction: \$6,339,580.00: 80% federal, 20% local.
