Project Description:

The Summit County Engineer's office proposes roadway maintenance activities on 1.46 miles of Valley View Road in a suburban area of Sagamore Hills and Northfield Center Townships in Summit County. The project limits on Valley View Road are from approximately 400 feet west of the intersection with Olde Eight Road to the intersection with Dunham Road. The proposed improvements include pavement resurfacing and repairs, aggregate/paved shoulder maintenance, pavement marking applications, driveway apron reconstruction, traffic signal equipment installation, manhole/catch basin/monument box adjustments to grade, and sign replacements. Also, widening substandard shoulders is planned where possible. The northwest bound approach of Valley View Road will be widened to include a left turn lane and a lane for through and right turn traffic. Mapping that depicts the project location on a topographic, aerial and county map are included in the Project File/General/Project Information subsection.

A minimum of one bidirectional lane will be maintained during construction. Construction lane restrictions will be posted within the project construction limits prior to the start of and during project construction. Substantial traffic disruptions are not expected during project construction.

Based on the project scope of work, its Path 1 designation and the proposed maintenance of traffic measures, emergency/public services were not notified regarding the project impacts.

The project will be constructed within the existing highway right-of-way.

Existing utilities within the project study area will not be impacted/relocated to construct the project, except for water lines and fire hydrants that will be modified due to roadway widening.

A Cultural Resources Records Check was performed by ODOT district environmental staff using the SHPO GIS online database. No Cultural Resources listed on or determined eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places were identified within and/or immediately adjacent to the proposed project area. The undertaking is a type that has minimal potential to cause effects to historic properties. No further coordination is required in accordance with the Section 106 Programmatic Agreement. In accordance with Stipulation V(C)(1) and Appendix A of the Section 106 Programmatic Agreement executed on June 29, 2023 (Agreement No. 38503), ODOT determined the project is a type of undertaking that has 'minimal potential to cause effects' to historic properties and is not a part of a larger undertaking. Based on the information in the Regulated Materials Review (RMR) Form completed for the project, further RMR activities or special materials management are not warranted for the project. See the RMR documentation for the project in the Project File/ESA/Reports subsection.

This project is considered ecologically exempt under the Ecological MOA (Agreement 19394). See the ecological documentation for the project in the Project File/Ecological/Reports subsection and the Ecological tab.

ODOT District 4 Environmental Section personnel reviewed the FEMA FIRM mapping for the project study area and found the proposed construction activities are not located within a designated Special Flood Hazard Area (SFHA) floodplain. Floodplain coordination is not required for the project. See the floodplain mapping and documentation for the project in the Project File/Permits/Floodplains subsection.

The project will not impact any environmentally sensitive resources within the project study area.
