Project Description:

The City of Canton Ohio proposes to mill, repair and resurface 12th Street NW from approximately Monument Road NW to State Route 43 (Walnut Avenue NE). Additional roadway maintenance improvements include partial/full depth pavement repairs, sidewalk and curb ramp reconstruction to meet Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards, curb and gutter replacement, monument/catch basin/conduit grade adjustments, traffic signal equipment modification/loop replacement, lighting repair/upgrades, pavement marker replacement and new lane/edge/center/channelizing/stop/crosswalk lines/other pavement markings applications, and traffic control signage replacement within the project limits.

Mapping that depicts the project location on United States Geological Survey (USGS) 7.5-Minute Topographic Quadrangle Mapping is included in the Project File/General/Project Information subsection as *USGS Quadrangle Topographical Map.pdf*. A minimum of one ten-foot lane will be maintained in each direction on 12th Street NW during pavement maintenance operations. Access shall be maintained to all adjacent properties throughout the project construction duration. Substantial traffic disruptions are not expected during project construction.

Based on the project scope of work, its Path 1 Project Development Process (PDP) Classification and the proposed maintenance of traffic measures, emergency/public services contact activities were not conducted for the project.

The project will be constructed within the existing street right-of-way.

Existing utilities within the project study area will not be impacted to construct the project.

A Cultural Resources Records Check performed using the SHPO GIS online database determined the project Area of Potential Effects (APE), the footprint of the project. The STA-12th Street (Canton) (PI: 122496) project is not a part of a larger undertaking and is a project type that has minimal potential to cause effects to historic properties in accordance with Stipulation V(C)(1) and Appendix A of the Section 106 Programmatic Agreement executed on June 29, 2023 (Agreement No. 38503), therefore, no further coordination is required for the project. See the cultural resources documentation for the project in the Project File/Cultural Resources/Project Information subfolder and the Cultural Resources Tab.

Based on the information in the Regulated Materials Review (RMR) Form completed for the project, further RMR activities or special materials management are not warranted for the project. See the RMR documentation for the project in the Project File/ESA/Reports subsection.

Additionally, this project is considered ecologically exempt under the Ecological MOA (Agreement 19394). See the *Ecologically Exempt STA-12th Street (Canton).pdf* for the project in the Project File/Ecological/Reports subsection.

The project will not impact any environmentally sensitive resources within the project study area.
