Project Description:

The City of Oregon is currently proposing to mill and resurface Navarre Ave (SR 2) from Athens Rd to 385 ft East of Lallendorf Rd in Lucas County due to poor pavement conditions. The project includes spot full depth repairs and associated necessary scope. All work is within the existing right of way and there are anticipated impacts to utilities. This project does not include impacts to any waterways or floodplains, therefore no US Army Corps of Engineers or floodplain permits are required. There are some ecological species located within 1 mile of the project sites, but there will be no impacts to any state or federally listed species or their habitat. There will be no impact to historically significant resources. Construction is expected to begin in the summer of 2027 and last approximately 45 days. During construction, one lane of traffic will be maintained at all times.
