Project Description:

The Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) proposes to replace roadway signs along various U.S. and state routes throughout Ashtabula and Trumbull Counties.

During project construction, a minimum of one ten (10)-foot lane of traffic shall be maintained in each direction on the existing pavement. No substantial traffic disruptions are anticipated with the project.

Based on the project scope of work, its Path 1 Preliminary Development Process (PDP) Classification and the proposed maintenance of traffic measures, emergency/public services contact activities were not conducted for the project.

This project will be constructed within the existing roadway rights-of-way.

Existing utilities within the project study areas will not be impacted/relocated to construct the project.

The project will occur entirely within existing rights-of-way or easements and will not impact a historic property or district. Therefore, in accordance with the State Funded and State/Local Funded Project Agreement (Revised) (Agreement No. 17075), dated August 29, 2012, and Appendix A, ODOT has determined that the proposed 100% state funded roadway sign replacement project is a type of project with minimal potential to cause effects to historic properties. The project will not impact any environmentally sensitive resources within the project study areas.
