Project Description:

The Ohio Department of Transportation is proposing to resurface US Route 6 in Henry County from the Defiance County line to US Route 6 due to poor pavement conditions and US Route 24 in Lucas County from mile 11.485 to 12.36 due to pavement conditions. After the EnviroNet file was set up the project the portion in Lucas County was added, so the actual project name is HEN/LUC-24-0.00/11.53. All work is within the existing right of way and there will be no impacts to utilities. There will be no work within any waters of the US so no permits from the US Army Corps of Engineers are required. This project is located in a floodplain, however the district hydraulic engineer has determined that there will be no impacts. There will be no impacts to any ecologically or historically significant resources. Construction is expected to begin in the summer of 2018 and last approximately 60 days. One lane of traffic will be maintained at all times throughout construction. A plan note is required due to the project being located within the City of Napoleon's Public Water System Corridor Management Zone.

This document was approved based on Stage 2 plans.

- 1) The Project Designer shall include either a note or show construction and right of way limits on the plans to show the Project Engineer and contractor that all work shall be performed within the existing right of way during construction.
- 2) Part 642-58 of the Traffic Engineering Manual shall be placed in the plans by ODOT to ensure compliance with Federal notification requirements.
- 3) The contractor shall take all precautions to prevent any and all material from going off the edge of bridge deck(s) and edge of culvert(s) during all construction operations. The contractor shall immediately remove through non-mechanical means any material that falls into the roadside ditches, streams, wetlands, or other waters. Under no circumstances shall the contractor work in or store equipment and/or materials in any wetlands, streams, or other waters. No work or staging is permitted below the top of bank of any stream and/or within a wetland.
- 4) ODOT shall include a note in the construction plans to address the project's location in relation to the drinking water source.
- 5) The Project Designer shall incorporate the following note into the plans: The contractor shall not remove any trees under this project. The project is located within the known habitat ranges of the federally listed and protected Indiana bat and northern long-eared bat. This requirement is necessary to avoid and minimize impacts to these species as required by the Endangered Species Act. For the purposes of this note, a tree is defined as a live, dying, or dead woody plant, with a trunk three inches or greater in diameter at a height of 4.5 feet above the ground surface, and with a minimum height of 13 feet.
