Project Description:

The City of Toledo is proposing to resurface Detroit Ave from Glendale Ave to Sherwood Road. Additional work includes curb and curb ramps. There will be no new right of way and there are no impacts to utilities anticipated. The required floodplain permit has been obtained and there are no waterways within the project area. This project area is urban and there are no ecologically significant resources within the project area. This project has minimal potential to cause effects to any historical resources since none were found in the project area. Construction is expected to begin in the summer of 2019 and last approximately 90 days. Pedestrian traffic will be maintained throughout construction.

This document was written and approved based on Stage 1 plans.
