Project Description:

The Ohio Department of Transportation is proposing to paint the structural steel of 5 bridges located on I-280 in Wood County. All work is within the existing right of way and there are no impacts to any utilities. All bridge locations are above roadways or railroads so no waterway permits from the US Army Corps of Engineers are required. None of the locations are within a special flood hazard area so no floodplain permits are required. There are no historical resources within the project limits so there will be minimum potential to cause effects. There are also no ecologically significant resources that will be impacted by this project. Construction is expected to begin in the summer of 2019. All work will be completed within 90 days. During construction, access on all roads will be maintained.
